Pastor's Page

Dear FUMC 'Ohana:

This month is one of the most pivotal in the history of our denomination. From February 23-26 in St. Louis, Missouri, a special session of the United Methodist General Conference will be held to respond to a report overseen by the Council of Bishops called A Commission of the Way Forward. The report is to give recommendations on the issue of human sexuality and the Church. 864 delegates from the United States, Africa, the Philippines, and Europe will decide the direction of the denomination for the future. Of those, there are four delegates from our California-Pacific annual conference; I am blessed to be one of them.

On February 3, I will be preaching at the 10:00 a.m. service on the impact this issue has on our denomination and our local church, as well as emphasizing my personal hope: that despite our differences, we will remain united as a denomination and a church.

On February 10 at 10:00 a.m., I will be preaching on the scriptural/theological insights on this issue.

On February 10 and 17, we will continue our Adult Bible studies on this topic, which will be in-depth and with essential dialogue.

The annual Britt Lectures return from February 15-17 plus a morning workshop on February 18. This year's lecturer is Dr. Diana Butler Bass, who is a Christian history professor who writes extensively on American religion and culture.

Please note that the lectures will be held at the Christ United Methodist Church on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. On Sunday morning at the 10:00 a.m. service, however, Dr. Bass will be preaching at First UMC.
