Ministry Musings

Dear FUMC 'Ohana:

April is the month in many places where people have emerged from a long, cold winter and spring comes into full bloom. In Hawaii, it is a bit more subtle we go from warm weather to warmer weather. But this is a time of planting, the planting of something that will sprout and then grow into the summer and a harvest in the fall.

One hundred years ago, however, a poet painted a different picture. T. S. Eliot, perhaps best known to the people of today as providing the literary inspiration for the musical "Cats," wrote a poem called the "Waste Land." He wrote that "April is the cruellest (sic) month, breeding Lilacs out of the dead land, mixing Memory and desire, stirring Dull roots with spring rain." What the poem in its totality meant was that while April was usually a time of abundance and renewal, that in the times he was living in, the hopes that were sprouted were extinguished by harsh conditions.

What is known about Eliot is that he was severely affected by destruction and despair from World War I. What is also known about Eliot is that he wrote a part of this poem while he and his wife were recovering from the Spanish Flu, the last global pandemic that claimed millions of lives. His words seem prophetic as we struggle through a wasteland of illness, death, suffering, and loneliness.

The question is: will this April be another month of cruelty? We are in a hopeful situation where vaccines are in growing supply and the projections seem to be moving earlier and earlier. We may be emerging from this COVID winter sooner than ever. Except...that if we lower our guard too soon, if we begin to ignore and even reject with disdain the precautions about the coronavirus that we have so carefully observed, we may have another surge and we will be back into a "winter of discontent."
