Dear FUMC 'Ohana:

MAY - A FOCUS ON FAMILY AND ALOHA

May 1 is celebrated as a special day in many places around the world. In Europe, it is a celebration that comes around the halfway point between the start of spring and the start of summer. It is marked by gathering flowers and branches and weaving garlands. The Maypole, or May Tree or May Bush, has people dancing around it in celebration of the day.

In Hawaii, May 1 is celebrated as Lei Day, wear, give and receive a lei, a symbol of aloha. Each island is represented by a different flower and color. For example, Oahu's flower is the 'ilima and the color is yellow. Hawaiian culture is primarily celebrated, but other cultural traditions are often recognized.

In Tongan culture, the first Sunday of May is a celebration of children, sometimes called White Sunday. The second Sunday corresponds with the mainstream American Mother's Day, but the third Sunday is for Father's Day, instead of the third Sunday in June in mainstream American culture.

At our English service, Pastor Kim Houff will be preaching on Mother's Day. Since I rarely have had an opportunity to preach on the third Sunday of June because of annual conference, I will be preaching a "Parents Day" sermon on the third Sunday in May.

I pray that we will honor our families however we define them - and share the aloha spirit during this month... and always.
