### UNDERSTANDING THE PASTORAL TRANSITION

One of the most important things about this transition is the proper protocol. My last Sunday is June 4 to create some distance from me to the time when Pastor Won-Seok begins on July 1.

The difficult thing is the one year noncontact protocol: for a year, I am not to initiate contact with former members of FUMC, and members are discouraged from making contact with me, and if we do see each other, we should avoid talking about FUMC. Pastor Won-Seok should be the point of contact for questions that may come up, such as "where is this or that?"

During this year, DS Saia Tu'itahi, the new West District Superintendent, will serve as the DS for First UMC and for Pastor Won-Seok.

On July 1, 2024, it is expected that I will assume the role of DS for First UMC and for Pastor Won-Seok.

It may seem like too much, but it is actually an important part of ensuring that Pastor Won-Seok will be successful and effective as quickly as possible, and become one of the pastors of First UMC, not only officially, but also emotionally and spiritually.

It's also important to note that Pastor Linita and Pastor Won-Seok will be co-pastors. They will share the administrative tasks and ordering of the parish, ably assisted by Pastor Kim, who will continue to be the minister of discipleship and community engagement.

Note that Pastor Linita will take over my office, and Pastor Won-Seok will take over Pastor Linita's office.

In this way, we will have a smooth transition and continue the great ministry at First UMC! Grace and aloha.


# DISASTER RELIEF FOR GUAM AND SAIPAN
