


Christmas Eve Service at 7 p.m.



Ministry Musings

"9In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. 11 And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.' 12 And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. 13 He was in the wilderness forty days, tested by Satan, and he was with the wild beasts, and the angels waited on him." (Mark 1:9-13, NRSVue)

Of which depiction of Jesus has your life been "disrupted?"

As a baby as the Gospels According to Matthew and Luke depict like we often see in our Advent and Christmas seasons? As the mysterious Word (*Logos*) who was in the beginning with G-d and WAS G-d as the Gospel According to John? Or was your introduction of Jesus as a fully grown man, among the many in the crowd, as the Gospel According to Mark depicts Jesus being baptized by John?

All of these Gospels each depict a moment by which we know the Jews were waiting for the Messiah, the Chosen and Anointed One. They were looking for a disruption from oppressive Roman rule, negligent and hypocritical Temple standards, and spiritual distance people felt with G-d. They were looking for G-d to liberate and free, enact justice and mercy, and redeem G-d's people to experience once again Immanuel, "G-d with us."

Advent, the season before Christmas, is a time of anticipation and preparation of the DISRUPTING PRESENCE of G-d with us. When thinking about the word "disruption," I imagine most use the word to describe something uncomfortable and inconvenient. We have had plenty of disruptions within our lives, like a sudden cry of a baby, or someone sharing some surprising news, or even being led to a dry and challenging season in our lives. We pray to G-d that we would NOT have these kinds of disruptions in our everyday lives, especially when faced with disruptions of global health, natural disasters, and economic and political wars.

And yet here we are in a season of preparation, where Advent is a time that we ARE asking G-d to disrupt our lives and to intervene. We ask G-d to intervene in our dysfunction by disrupting acts of injustice and oppression. We ask G-d to intervene in our hunger and emptiness by disrupting gluttonous and greedy pursuits covered by abuse and violence. We ask G-d to intervene in our pain by disrupting our avoidance and intentional ignorance through compassion and healing. We ask G-d to intervene in our lives by disrupting our fears and weakness to a courage and bold love the world so needs!

Come and join us each week in December as we look out and prepare for the DISRUPTING PRESENCE of Jesus Christ, who comes to disrupt our lives in holy hope, peace, joy, and love!


December Fellowship Time


