Ministry Musings Pastor Won-Seok Yuh Co-Pastor

"I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace: there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift." (Ephesians 4:1-7, NRSVue)

While I was at a summer youth church retreat, my mother registered my high school freshman schedule for me, and had my last period set for football. CENTERING PRAYER Tuesdays at 5:30 – 6:00 p.m. in the Butterworth Chapel

In the season of Lent, we remember, again, the story of the inauguration of God's kingdom in the death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

Traditionally, people of faith commemorate this season by abstaining from certain common activities as a spiritual discipline to express solidarity with Christ's sacrifice for us on the cross.

This year you are invited to choose another option for your Lenten Spiritual Discipline: Regular, dedicated, quiet time with God, The Holy Spirit.

While God, The Holy Spirit, is given to be with us, and in us, we are often too distracted to notice his presence by the myriad issues of daily living. Centering prayer is a method by which we learn to detach ourselves from these distractions- to free usto be present, on purpose, with the presence of God, The Holy Spirit.

Centering prayer springs from The Ancient Christian Practice of "The Prayer of Silence". It's stated purpose is simply: "To Consent To The Presence and Action of The Holy Spirit Within" it is based on the Dictum of Psalm 46:11 "Be still, then, and know that I Am God!"

Help establish your new practice of centering prayer at a workshop at Wesley UMC, 1350 Hunakai St. on February 10, 2024, from 9 am – 12 noon, facilitated by Pastor Amy Wake. Four weekly follow-up sessions will be offered at First United Methodist to support your new centering prayer practice. In addition, I will be hosting regular group centering prayer sessions throughout the year every Tuesday afternoon at 5:30-6 p.m. in the Butterworth Chapel.


