## Ministry Musings

Pastor Won-Seok Yuh Co-Pastor

"10When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. 11On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." (Matthew 2:10-11, NRSVue)

Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, and Happy Epiphany!

Did you know that, as with some Christian traditions, we follow a pattern marked by a three-part celebration?

It starts with <u>the Season of Advent</u>, a time to prepare for the coming of the present and presence of Emmanuel, G-d with us, Jesus Christ. Then comes the celebration of the 12 days in <u>the Season of Christmas</u> starting from December 25<sup>th</sup> (like the popular song that gifts a total 184 birds, 364 birds, or 12 mynah birds). Last in the trio comes <u>the Season of Epiphany</u>, starting in January 6 (old Christmas Eve) with the Celebration of the Shepherds to January 7 (old Christmas Day) with the Celebration of the Magi.

The three gifts prepared by the Magi were presented to Jesus, recognizing who he was before he had done any ministry or performed any miracles as a human being. Gold marked Jesus' power and authority equal to royalty,

apart from the silver of the merchants and the copper of the lowly. Frankincense marked Jesus' divine connection with G-d as it was special incense used for prayer. Myrrh, which would sometimes be crushed and burned as a calming incense or mixed with oil for healing or embalming, marked Jesus' life from compassionate healing to prepared death.

As marked by the Magi's gifts, the Season of Epiphany is about discovery, delight, and direction! Oh, to discover that mark of G-d that values humanity toward the power of love and redemption! Oh, to delight in that mark of G-d that made manifest Emmanuel, G-d's presence and connection with us! Oh, to direct ourselves toward that mark of G-d that guides us to give of ourselves in life, in death, and all in between!

Join us as we begin our new series on "Epiphany: On Your Mark!" – "marked" with our Installation Service for Lay Leadership and Holy Communion on January 7! To dive deeper, join us in our upcoming weekly Bible studies on the Gospel of Mark.

As we begin this new year, may we discover G-d's mark of holy love and powerful redemption in us and in our neighbors, and may we be led by the Holy Spirit to follow the mark of Jesus Christ for the holy and compassionate transformation of our world.
