Ministry Musings

"20'I ask not only on behalf of these but also on behalf of those who believe in me through their word, ²¹that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²²The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, ²³I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me.'

(John 17:20-23, NRSVue)

From all the examples of Jesus' ministry demonstrated in miracles, teachings, and acts of love, one practice of Jesus that I treasure most often is how Jesus connects with G-d, especially through prayer. I appreciate those who wrote the gospels, those who sustained the gospels, and those who translated the gospels to help us remember that even Jesus had a prayer request!

How hard must it be that even Jesus had to pray for us to be one as Jesus and G-d are one? According to the Book of Genesis, humanity had one of its chances to be made one during the building of the Tower of Babel (unpacking that story is a whole Bible study of its own). We might think that if all of humanity could speak only one unified language, how much more efficiently and effectively we might be able to work together. Yet, how often have we spoke the same language and still not fully understood each other? And how much harder is it to possibly understand the divine, holy, and mysterious things of G-d (as Jesus describes in Mark 8:32)?

While it seems that in every Season of Lent,

our world feels more divided due to social, economic, and political differences, the call for us in this time is to be collectively attentive to the hurt in our world: exclusion and marginalization, neglect and poverty, corruption and oppression. In our Lenten journey, we detach from our personal comforts to alleviate another's suffering, we divest from personal acquisition to fulfill another's dire needs; and we direct our attention from amassing personal power to surrendering to G-d's presence in the world.

In a similar way that we prepared ourselves for the coming of Jesus Christ into our lives during the Season of Advent, we prepare ourselves for the return of the Body of Christ, both in the members to the Body <u>and</u> in the resurrection of the Body. Our fasting during the Season of Lent is about more than letting go, whether it be in activities or food or attitudes. It is about being active witnesses of G-d's <u>agape</u> love that calls us to wholly serve and whose Holy Spirit moves to "Make Us One"!

May we be made one in serving the needy; one in crying out "Hosanna!" and "Save us!"; one in remembering the way Jesus loved, suffered, and rose again; one in celebrating that Jesus is risen! May it be so as we commit to love G-d and love one another in this Holy Lent: to be made one in Christ, one with each other, and one in all the ministries with the world!

As Jesus prayed for us: MAKE US ONE, O LORD! AMEN!


